CES 2020: FirstNet Authority highlights innovation for public safety

From January 7-11, the First Responder Network Authority (FirstNet Authority) participated in CES and CES Government (CESG). For the FirstNet Authority, the world's largest and most influential technology conference of the year was an opportunity to witness and discuss the newest tools and techniques designed to enhance emergency response and recovery for first responders.

Throughout the conference, the FirstNet Authority team engaged with innovators, technology-enthusiasts, and public safety thought leaders about FirstNet's deployment status, nationwide expansion of the network, and plans for 2020.

To kick off the FirstNet Authority's participation, Senior Product Director, **Dr. Jennifer Harder**, took part in the panel discussion "Network Infrastructure is Key to Smart Cities." Jen's remarks focused on public safety working as a major economic engine for the smart city ecosystem. The discussion emphasized the role smart infrastructure plays supporting first responders with response and recovery, which in turn helps communities rebuild faster.

Speaking at a CESG session, FirstNet Authority's Senior Public Safety Advisor **Bill Schrier** drew attention to the potential for new technologies in policing in "Technologies to Fight Crime, Terrorism and Protect the Homeland." Also at CESG, **Ed Parkinson** delivered the plenary keynote address, "Accelerating Innovation for Public Safety." Ed discussed FirstNet's growing influence on driving the public safety marketplace in new directions, including delivering new solutions that enhance on-demand coverage, and FirstNet's increasing momentum nationwide with over **one**


million connections. Ed also touched on plans for the network in 2020, including push-to-talk, standards for mission-critical location based services, video and data, and enhancing FirstNet's 5G-ready dedicated core.

Throughout the conference, the FirstNet Authority team worked with **Public Safety Communications Research** (**PSCR**) colleagues at the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) to engage attendees on PSCR programs, research, and funding opportunities for public safety.

We would like to applaud the Consumer Technology Association for hosting another successful CES and CESG. The FirstNet Authority was pleased to participate and share our progress on building a network that provides lifesaving technologies to our nation's first responders.


